 around the redesign of I-475, with the segment of roadway on the north

• Up 6% in property crimes

• College Cultural area has experienced an increase in car "smash-and-grabs" and petty property crimes; according to reports and videos from the area, it seems to be 3 teenagers in a Black Chevrolet Blazer, but Flint PD has not been able to get a clear plate on the vehicle yet

Flint PD has stepped up patrols in the area and is working with Mott Community
 College PD to help apprehend the individuals

 Flint PD suggests reporting any suspicious activities to them, keeping porch lights on to limit opportunities for such crimes, and not leaving your vehicle on while unattended (even if it's cold out!)

 Booth suggested calling Flint PD's non-emergency number regarding unwanted noise/dogs barking in neighborhoods: 810-237-6800

o Carma asked about Midway Apartments (formerly Evergreen Regency) based on the calls she'd been getting from the area. Booth noted Flint PD met with Midway Apartments' manager and property owner and put in place specialty assignments, a special investigative unit and a special patrol over the past few months. Booth said the PD has seen a decrease in criminal activity in response to these measures.
