

Workshop Goals

- We want to understand <u>your</u> priorities for how transit should connect riders in Flint.
- Each group will work together to make changes to Flint's existing transit system.
 - <u>Step 1</u>: Identify the group's top three priorities for transit.
 - Step 2: Determine how these needs should be served on the map.
 - <u>Step 3</u>: Report back to the large group for discussion.

Workshop Rules

- 1. Place string or fill in lines on the map only when your group has agreed on what to do
- 2. Color in sections of existing routes that your group would like to maintain
- 3. Place string to show changes to existing routes or to create new routes
- 4. When adding length to an existing route or creating a new route, your team should decide where to reduce service by a roughly equivalent amount to avoid exceeding current operating costs
- 5. If time allows, teams will be asked to create an increased funding scenario and add on to existing or create new routes (without reducing service along other routes)
- 6. Explain your recommendations in the "Notes" section of the map.
- 7. Designate a speaker to report back to the group.

How often do these trips occur?

Daily / Weekly / Monthly / Infrequent

What destinations need to be served?

Where can riders make connections?
