- Rx Kids Flint is leading the charge for support to newborns and their families across the state
- Encouraged people to get involved in the review of the City's comprehensive plan. Next meeting is on Oct. 10 and will cover infrastructure and community facilities. A full schedule and more information can be found here.
- Flint's ambulance service has been launched. Two ambulances are in service with a third on the way.

Genesee County Land Bank Presentation, Teresa Gillotti

- Working on obtaining a Community Change Grant from the Environmental Protection Agency
 - Applying for \$15-16 million
 - Working with other organizations to support goals of grant, including hiring staff support
- Land Bank would be partnering with Neighborhood Engagement Hub, Habitat for Humanity, Genesee Conservation District, the Clean and Green Program, and also with the Police Foundation to do some evaluation as well
- Intent is to do more residential demolitions, prioritizing burn-outs (~350 demolitions over 3 years); expand the dumping prevention program; rehabilitate housing; community engagement
